

Ten By Ten: Learning III for Sustainability

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Ten sustainability educators, in ten global locations, involved in ten different integral sustainability education programs, engaged in a reflective practice to see what they might together have learned at a Learning III level about sustainability pedagogy. Calling this the 10x10 Inquiry, this guided process of inquiry collected over 100 Learning III perspectives (i.e. learnings from unlearnings about the process of teaching in sustainability education) from practitioners with over 100 years collective experience.

The results of the inquiry were compiled into a single location and coded using a process of holistic structuralism, which examines linkages in levels of observation in the cross-scalar dynamics of conceptual emergent holarchies. To disclose the synthesis of the meta-themes that emerged, the 148 discrete coded insights have been spatially related using the on-line collaborative visual mapping tool 'debategraph'.

Initially done for the contributors' own professional development and practice, the results of their collaborative inquiry will be shared and explored experientially using embodied interactive voice dialogue. The meta-themes identified were: *1. Design of Container, 2. Individuality of Learning, 3. Integration of Dependencies, 4. Extent of Experiencing, 5. Openness to Unknowing, 6. Connection to Others, 7. Community of Caring, 8. Stage of Development, and 9. Presence of Presenter.* This inquiry asks the specific question of how sustainability pedagogy is different in intention, content and collaboration to other forms of adult education. The engagement with this material invites a discussion into the subtleties and overlooked fundamentals of sustainability education, so as to promote one's own reflective practice towards being a skilful and aware educator in sustainability. The proposition for a different form of educational experience, a sustainability andragogy, is explored.
